This shrine is recognizable by its golden dome and tall flag pole.

While many of us have visited this historical site at least once in our lifetime, it is definitely a place one can visit time and time again for not only its history but also for its modern day renovations and new museums. We entered through the Lahori Gate and were welcomed by a colorful and busy market of all types of handicrafts, shawls, toys, etc. It is to be seen to believe the gay festivity there. We visited the newly opened museums; the picturesque narratives on the walls brought back memories of school day history lessons.









The IASAP birthday was celebrated in style in the bus with a mouthwatering chocolate walnut cake and a birthday song, arranged by our guide, Ms. Tripti. We also took this opportunity to wish members who had their birthdays from August to December. Our next surprise destination was the Waste Wonder Park near Sarai Kalekhan. The 7 wonders of the world are recreated in this park using industrial wastes. Discussion/Presentation/Extempore. It became easier with the strong support of IASAP Mentors and seniors to achieve this goal and make the Delhi Chapter proud.



But, to avoid letting success get to your head, here are a few strategies you can apply:


